Sandy Huber is the first and only Executive Director of the NJ Clean Communities Council, a position she has held since 2003.

As director, she has developed communications strategy aimed at educating the public about litter abatement and the proper handling of solid waste. She has been effective in developing innovative programs for children, including the Clean Communities Environmental Student Exchange and the statewide media campaign, *Slam Dunk the Junk*.

Prior to 2003, Sandy was employed by the NJ Department of Environmental Protection. During her tenure, she held several managerial positions. Sandy was manager of the state Clean Communities program, Communications Manager in the department's Division of Solid Waste Management, and Administrator of the DEP Communications Office.

A native of Norfolk, Virginia, Sandy moved to New Jersey in 1987 to be part of the team that set up the original state Clean Communities Program. She began her career in 1983 as the Clean Communities Coordinator of *Norfolk Cleaner Because We Care*.

She holds a bachelor of arts in English from Old Dominion University, with post graduate work in journalism and visual arts at the School of Visual Arts, NYC, and New York University. Awards include an EPA Region 2 Environmental Quality Award.
