NJ Clean Communities Council Gives the “Environmental Quality Award” to the State Beach Buggy Association



SEASIDE HEIGHTS, NJ – June 24, 2014 – The New Jersey Beach Buggy Association (NJBBA), a statewide association dedicated to the preservation of natural beach resources, has received the “Environmental Quality Award” from the New Jersey Clean Communities Council.

Sandy Huber, executive director of New Jersey Clean Communities Council, said the buggy association had a tremendous response in the aftermath of Superstorm Sandy in the Barnegat Bay towns, as well as on Long Beach Island. In addition, the association launched a program to plant leftover Christmas trees on dunes to protect the property during the rebuilding process.

Since 1954, the buggy association has fought to preserve beach access for all beach users. “The NJBBA not only builds protective fences and plants dune grasses to protect beaches, but gets involved with community leaders and other worthy organizations to

keep beaches open for all types of uses,” Huber said. “From birding to fishing and horseback riding or just for folks who like to walk the beach, the association is there.”
