The Pennsylvania Avenue School Earns the "NJ Beach Bird Award" from the New Jersey Clean Communities Council

Students from the Pennsylvania Avenue School were also instrumental in a statewide upcycling program that took place at Boardwalk Hall this year. Students helped collect thousands of water bottles that were used to create a sculpture of a Beach Bird, made from the recycled materials. Moreover, the students also named the bird – PASquale – with the PAS representing Pennsylvania Avenue School.
